- **A.** Compulsory Case Study of 10 Marks must be covered based on the topics Unit 4: Human Resource Training and Development and Unit 5: Training Methods.
- **B.** Case Study should be of moderate size only to create the understanding of the subject and to ensure active participation of the students and continuous learning process.
- **C.** Two short notes of 8 marks in the format of attempt any two (i.e. 4 marks each) out of the units covering less weightage.
- **D.** Total number of questions will be five. All questions will carry equal weightage i.e. 18 marks of each. All the topics and sub topics should be covered from the books mentioned in References.
- **E.** First four questions serially marked from 1 to 4 will be of 18 marks each with internal choice format requiring comprehensive coverage of entire syllabus, must be asked and there should not be more than two parts in a question. For Example:
